P.E and School Sport Premium Funding 2023-2024

The Government provides funding through the Sports Premium Funding. For the academic year 2022-2023, Briercliffe Primary School will receive £19,230. The funding is paid directly to school to improve the quality of P.E and School Sports.

With the Sports Premium funding, this year we aim to:

- Buy in to the Burnley School Sports Partnership
- Support staff in the delivery of high quality P.E through regular, targeted CPD that develops their practice.
- Continue to provide interventions to target children who need to develop specific fundamental movement skills.
- Sustain current physical activity opportunities during lunchtimes and after school clubs and implement further opportunities for physical activity through morning clubs.
- Use specialist coaches and external providers to deliver a broad range of extra-curricular sports clubs for all year groups.
- Provide training for EYFS staff on how to deliver the Tots on Tyres and Learn2Ride for all pupils in EYFS
- Purchase balance bikes and helmets to ensure the sustainability of the Tots on Tyres for future years.
- Provide opportunities of UKS2 pupils to take part in Bikeability Levels 1 and 2.
- To engage in cluster competitions within the community focusing on participation for all children in school and giving children opportunities to take part in competitive sport against children from other schools.
- To hold inter and intra school competitions to promote higher levels of competitiveness within the school.
- To promote physical activity, sport and wellbeing in school through our annual Sports week in connection with National School Sports Week.
- To provide opportunities for pupils to take on the role of sports leader becoming a role model for sport and physical activity in our school.
- Provide our children with an enriched P.E curriculum that allows children to participate in a wide range of sports, teaching them not only the physical skills but also key life skills. These are implemented into every PE lesson through the teaching of character values such as empathy, co-operation, teamwork and respect.
- Continue the assessment of Fundamental Movement Skills in Years 1 and 2 and tailor our curriculum to match pupils needs as well as providing interventions to ensure all our pupils are mastering FMS.
- Continue to provide a term of swimming lessons for our Year 3 and Year 4 pupils to ensure that all children are able to achieve the national curriculum targets for swimming. Also, provide swimming intervention sessions for pupils in Year 4 who are working towards being able to swim 25 metres competently.
- To continue to enhance and improve the P.E resources and equipment available to ensure all pupils are able to excel in all areas of the curriculum.
