What are we learning about?

<p>This half term our English work will be based on the core text 'Paddington' by Michael Bond.</p> <p>The children will be immersed into the text, responding to different parts of chapter 1. They will be thinking about character's thoughts and feelings and finding evidence in the text to support this. They will be learning how to use subordinating clauses and speech marks in order to use these in their final outcome which will be an innovated chapter of Paddington.</p>	<p>In Maths this half term we will be learning:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• to compare the place value of numbers up to 1000• to round to the nearest 10• to add and subtract multiples of 10 and 100.• to measure length in cm and m• to learn how to calculate the perimeter• to draw bar charts• to add and subtract numbers formally
